Preparation Instructions: 24-Hour pH Study No Medications for One Week

Preparation for your 24-hour pH study

- You are not sedated so you will be able to drive yourself home.
- Please allow at least one hour for the test.

Medication information

- Some of the medicine you take may need to be stopped or adjusted temporarily. You should discuss all insulin or diabetes medications with the prescribing provider before the 24-hour pH Study. Do not stop these medications without the consent of your provider.

One (1) week before your 24-hour pH study

- You will need to hold your prescription antacids and over the counter Prilosec.
 - Nexium/Esomeprazole
 - Aciphex/Rabeprazole
 - Prevacid/lansoprazole
 - Protonix/Pantoprazole
 - Prilosec/Omeprazole/Prilosec OTC/Zegerid
 - Dexilant/Dexlansoprazole

The day of your 24-hour pH study

- Remember you cannot have anything to eat or drink 4 hours prior to the study.
- Do not wear jewelry. Please leave valuable objects at home or with family members.
- Dress comfortably.

After your 24-hour pH study

- You will be asked to keep a written diary of any symptoms for the next 24 hours.
- You will be asked not to swim, shower, or immerse yourself in water once the tube is placed.
- You may sponge bathe or shampoo in the sink so please plan according.
- The following day you will return to the clinic for a short appointment to have the tube removed.
- The nasal tube should not interfere with usual activities but is very visible to others. Be sure to keep this in mind while planning your day.
