Central MN Child Advocacy Center (CAC) staff recently learned that an offender in a case referred to the CAC in August 2021 was found guilty and sentenced to many years in prison.

Thanks to the generosity of donors, CAC staff are able to offer so many needed services to those we serve.

In this case, three siblings were interviewed and provided medical exams. An Integrated Behavioral Health provider was able to offer brief psychotherapy sessions the day



they were seen at the CAC and as needed until they were able to start meeting with an outpatient psychotherapist. The Child & Family Advocate working with those children and their nonoffending caregiver provided ongoing advocacy since August 2021 to help the family get the services and resources they needed to help them start their healing process.
